Far too often we hear about abused or neglected children – sometimes it's the kind of story that makes you cringe, other times it breaks your heart. I worked at <u>Onslow County Partnership for</u> <u>Children</u> (OCPC), where reducing childhood abuse and neglect has always been an important part of our mission. Now, a new movement in prevention is changing our perspective on prevention. We are developing a broader approach to address the experiences and circumstances associated with

abuse and neglect.

20 years ago, a large-scale epidemiological study by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and Kaiser Permanente identified childhood abuse and neglect as two of ten **Adverse Childhood Experiences** (ACEs) that correlate to chronic disease, mental illness, and social problems later in life.
